International Activities

Growth of the Essential 100

The Essential 100 Challenge™ (the E100) is a Bible reading program developed by Scripture Union USA. Built around 100 carefully selected Bible passages, it enables people to get the big picture of God's Word from Genesis to Revelation. In the process, participants develop a daily Bible reading habit. Designed for 'community' use, the E100 enables a group or church to reflect, listen, learn and grow together. SU in partnership with Bible Societies and Wycliffe Global Alliance launched this program in other countries in 2010 including New Zealand, Australia, and UK. SU International also began the process of developing E100 for Children and Youth.

E100 for children, known as 'The Big Bible Challenge', includes a resource book that challenges children to explore God's big story through 20 journeys, each illustrated by a full-colour fold-out picture and interesting questions. The program also encourages the support of a 'coach' (a parent, camp leader, Sunday School teacher...) who will help each child explore God's Word. There are also plans for a website that includes interactive games, Bible audio and more.



A multi-national team from organisations including SU, Bible Society and Logosdor is developing E100 for Youth. The aim is to encourage online communities interacting around the E100 readings and sharing reflections through audio, video and picture. This program will also include an E100 application for Facebook.



Leading Staff Development Course 2010

In March 2010, 47 people from 30 countries gathered for the Leading Staff Development Course 2010 in Nairobi, Kenya. The aims were to provide an opportunity for leaders to take a fresh look at the world we live in, SU ministry and their leadership. This was done through providing for refreshment and time to build friendships with colleagues from around the globe. Key speakers included Rev Joe Kapolyo, originally from Zambia, Minister at Edmonton Baptist Church in London and author of 'The Human Condition'; Rev David Smith lecturer in Urban Mission and World Christianity and author of various books, and Mario Brühlmann, executive advisor and lecturer in Switzerland, Eastern Europe, and Asia. Participants had the opportunity to visit a mission project in the area including a medical centre in one of the largest slums in Nairobi and two children's homes.

Participants comments:

The sessions on globalisation opened my eyes and challenged me about ministry in my situation at home.

The conversations with people with a strong vision were very challenging.

This provided a broader understanding of SU and a great sense of being part of a global family.



Collaboration with Other Organisations...

4/14 Window Global Summit

In September 2010, over 700 leaders from around the world, including SU representatives, met in New York for the second 4/14 Window Global Summit. Delegates, including young people, considered how churches and mission agencies can be alerted to the potential of children and young people between the ages of 4 to 14 to bring transformation to the world. Wendy Strachan, a member of the International Steering Group, said that, 'Whilst the concept of discipling young people for service is so central to SU's thinking and ethos, it's great to see churches and agencies once again wanting to make this a central focus'.

Micah Challenge 10.10.10

Micah Challenge is a global coalition of Christians seeking to hold Governments to account for their promise to halve extreme poverty by 2015. On 10 October 2010 Scripture Union Movements were involved in mobilising children and young people to join together around the world to pray against poverty and to declare that all children deserve the opportunity to be the people God wants them to be. The Micah campaign and SU's participation continues as we share their aim of reducing poverty and concern for children around the world.



Africa Region



2010 was a great year for SU Africa.

In March we hosted the SU International LSSDC, and then the SU International Council meeting in September. In May the first SU Africa Leadership Summit, with 35 national movements represented by National Directors and Chairmen, was held. Other officers of the Regional Council also attended the summit. It was a great joy to have with us the International Director and the International Business & Development Manager.

In 2010, SU Nigeria celebrated 120 years of ministry, DR Congo celebrated 50 years, while Madagascar marked 125 years since the first Bible reading card was published in the local language.

A thriving ministry to children and youth was reported by the national movements, with innovative ideas including 'Hope Alive' in Swaziland and 'Churches Channels of Hope Program' in Zambia, as well as the timely ministry to vulnerable children and women in DR Congo. We have many reasons to praise the Lord for 2010.

The First SU Africa Leadership Summit Held in Nairobi

The first Scripture Union Africa Leadership Summit was held in Nairobi, Kenya from 18 - 23 May 2010. The theme of the Summit, which was attended by 82 delegates from 35 national movements, was Hope and Transformation in line with the SU Africa vision and mission statements.

The Summit had plenary sessions, time for small group discussion and workshops, in addition to daily Bible expositions from 2 Timothy. The Summit allowed for critical thinking on the core aspects of SU ministry – children's ministry, Bible, youth and family, including Aid for AIDS and Lifeskills. Good suggestions were made on the way forward for each of these aspects. These will be followed up by ministry coordinators.

Bible Ministry Celebrated

SU Bible ministry is highly valued in Africa. We have some vernacular languages that do not have any Bible commentaries except for the SU notes. The 125th Anniversary of the Malagasy Bible reading card in August was therefore a great occasion in Madagascar. It was marked by a four day conference, a musical concert led by the SU band attended by over 4,000 people, as well as the commissioning of a new garden and Prayer House.

SU Nigeria has a great ambition to expand the Bible ministry. They are planning to distribute a million Bible reading notes in 2011.

Americas Region



2010 began with two major disaster situations in the Americas Region: a devastating earthquake in Haiti and another shortly after in Chile.

The newly-born movement in Haiti faced an overwhelming challenge. Donald Tardif (LLB Canada) did an outstanding job of seeking funds internationally, while providing guidance for the team in Haiti. Vital supplies were distributed amongst the thousands of needy and relocated people at St. Marc.



SU Haiti established 'La Corde' (pictured above) – providing education, materials, Bibles, Bible classes and a daily meal for a group of 30 children who were living as modern-day slaves. The year closed with serious riots, due to the elections, on the streets of St Marc, which made it impossible to open the school for the 'La Corde' program for a short time. LLB Haiti has grown and matured very rapidly in 2010. The risks, dangers and threats seem to have no power over Galilee Perilus, LLB staff and volunteers. Something BIG is going to happen...

SU Chile

On the morning of 27 February, Chile awoke to a massive earthquake, the worst in 70 years. The destructive quake affected 80% of the country's population and caused damage to SU Chile's building in Santiago, the capital. During the year SU Chile's ministry to teenagers provided post-trauma assistance to more than 2700 teens in their three centres in Santiago. The Government asked SU Chile to extend their service to the south, in cities where the impact of the quake was more severe. SU Chile's leadership continues to train young graduates in the skills needed for this difficult task.

SU USA

Ecclesiastes says that there is a time for everything and 2010 was a time for celebration for SU USA – a time of jubilee – with 50th Anniversary celebrations. God was given the glory and honour for a rich history of sustained outreach ministry through beach missions, and the more recent successful ministries of SUpErKids, Prime Time and the E100 Challenge. The occasion was celebrated by more than 200 people at a banquet on 1 October. Rev. Colin Sinclair, Chairman of the SUI Council, was the guest speaker and Dr Luis Palau was present through a video greeting.



Britain & Ireland Region

This year has seen an encouraging re-emphasis on meeting with God through the Bible and prayer, which underpins all of our evangelistic and discipling ministry. The examples on this page are just two of many.

With 2011 seeing the 400th anniversary of the King James Bible, movements have been preparing to use the opportunities it presents to help Christians focus again on meeting God through the Scriptures, in particular through the E100 Challenge.

Alongside this, evangelistic and discipling work has continued to develop. Around the region there has been encouraging growth in locally-based schools ministry. Despite the economic climate, generous gifts meant that SU Republic of Ireland was able to start the redevelopment of their Ovoca Manor centre and also appoint a worker to develop a new children's ministry.

Scotland Prayer

Prayer is high on SU Scotland's agenda. *Prayer for Schools Scotland* aims to see 'every school a prayed-for school'. And more than 1,000 of Scotland's 2,700 schools now have people committed to pray for them.

Events such as *Strictly Come Praying* and *Back to School with God Sunday* have become an important part of the calendar for many young Christians. And now with *Pray Any Way* there is an event for parents and children together. One staff worker said, 'the best part of the event was seeing the young people praying for the adults'.

SU Siberia Children's Work Conference

'With love for the Word', SU Siberia's children's work conference in Omsk influenced more than the delegates! When the conference hall was unavailable, sessions were held in the bar. The two bar staff joined in the Bible games being taught and other guests were intrigued by what was happening!

A Sunday School teacher said, 'Andrei Chernyak's talks on the *Integrity of Scripture* challenged us as to whether we have a sufficiently deep relationship with our Creator to be able to hear His voice through His Word.'

'There was an atmosphere of unity... There were Orthodox Christians, Lutherans, Baptists, Pentecostals and Charismatics but we clearly felt that we are all

children of one Heavenly Father. We talked a lot about Jesus Christ and what He means to us. The Word was at work!'



East & West Asia Region



Our Region has entered a new stage!

Rev. Koh Gim Lam, Regional General Secretary for 18 years, retired at the end of December 2010. Rev. Tadashi Oyamada, General Secretary of SU Japan for 13 years, is the new CEO. Training Local Pastors in Bible Reading Methods

Pancar Pijar Alkitab (PPA – SU Indonesia)

In the past it has been difficult for PPA to get permission from the synods for pastors from big churches to attend training in Bible Reading Methods due to the SU staff member not having theological training.

But God opened up a way in early 2010, when a theological college graduate joined the staff and was able to continue the training program, despite financial challenges.

PPA is also developing children's ministry in Manado – equipping Sunday School teachers and Christian Religion teachers.

SU Myanmar

The church in Myanmar continues to grow as Christians testify about the Lord Jesus Christ. Christians make up about 5-10% of the population. Pastor Dorothy of SU Myanmar and Lavender, the SU staff worker, run six SU Clubs. Lavender (formerly a radio broadcaster) takes a 2 hour bus trip to one of the SU Clubs. 40-50 children eagerly wait for her in a small hut in the village. Lavender teaches the children to sing and play, and preaches the Word of God each week. Her programs are well received!

Children who attended the first Roma Children's Camp in Serbia said:

- Josa: I am thankful for my best friends and teachers and the lady who cooked for us delicious food. Thank you for the wonderful six days we spent with you. We won't forget you.
- Denisa: The camp was great. I most liked music worship because we learn to sing new songs about God. Lidija is the best music teacher. I liked my room because it was large and light - and I really loved the food. I hope that other campers also had a very nice time.
- Mariana (a helper in the kitchen): I am impressed and amazed with the SU work with children from a Roma background, and the love and patience the leaders had for them. I was also impressed with everything they have learnt from the Bible and from Jesus. I am glad that I was in this camp because if I would have stayed at home and if someone would say to me how great this camp was, I wouldn't believe him.



Leadership Training Camp – Czech Republic

Each young person who wants to be a junior leader at one of our camps takes part in a Leadership Training Camp. They learn a range of skills including how to: give a camp talk; lead a small group Bible study; run a sports or craft workshop; lead a person to Christ; give a testimony; know how and why it is important to meet with Jesus each day through personal Bible study and prayer, even at camp; pray for other people, understand what it means to be a servant leader.

This training event has operated for a number of years and we are grateful to God for glimpses of fruit in individuals who are working in local churches such as:

- Honza who is now responsible for training and developing all the small group leaders in his church
- Peter who is now studying theology and helps his pastor with training in his church
- Ben, Marketa and Aja who led for the first time one of our summer evangelistic camps.

Pacific Region



SU throughout the Pacific Region continues to grow as we review the approach to ministry, initiate new ideas and continually aim to be faithful in serving Christ in our region among children, young people and families.

Ken Edgecombe has retired after 10 years as Chair, with Wayne Fraser becoming our new Chair. A very successful conference in Vanuatu in December focussed on training Children's and Youth ministry leaders throughout the Pacific Islands. SU in Australia is undergoing a review of its purposes and structure. The E100 Challenge is being rolled out across the region and other Bible engagement initiatives are planned. Essential Jesus is being rolled out in NZ in 2011.

Work in schools is thriving, with ELEVATE and School Chaplaincy continuing to grow in size and effectiveness. Australian Government funding for Chaplaincy is being challenged in the High Court as being unconstitutional. If this challenge is successful, young people will miss out on a vital pastoral support program in thousands of schools across Australia. Please pray for the Queensland movement as they face this challenge.

Partnering in the Pacific

The December conference in Vanuatu was held at the redeveloped SU campsite near Port Vila - the fruit of the partnership with SU New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory. Our conference included two sessions aimed at growing our awareness of each other as part of the regional SU family, building relationships and discussing how we can best find mutual benefit in working together.

Other examples of effective partnering include assistance with training, office equipment and student visits. A group within the region 'Sustain' has been established to assist Pacific Island movements to develop property assets, thus increasing their revenue and resourcing ministry.

Camp for Prisoners' Kids

An exciting development in New Zealand is the very first SUPAKidz Camp for children of prisoners to be held in Wellington in July 2011. Developed in partnership with Prison Fellowship NZ who run a faith-based unit at the Rimutaka Prison, this is a significant opportunity for SU NZ to reach another part of the community. At the launch of this initiative in November, supporters of Prison Fellowship were extremely enthusiastic, suggesting ideas for future possibilities. This will be a fun, Bible-based, safe camp, creating a positive experience for these children, who, as research shows, are often victims themselves.

South Asia Region



In 2010 the South Asia Region experienced many blessings in spite of common challenges.

A 'change' in the traditional ministry outlook is slowly but steadily spreading over the region. A sense of interdependence and shared vision has deepened the commitment to serve. Nepal and Sri Lanka began youth ministries, while India expanded into the Northern Territory. Tsunami centres in India have become Tuition Centres and have had a tremendous impact on remote Indian children and villages. Setbacks in the ministry in Bangladesh have resulted in a renewed and enthusiastic vision for SU Children's Ministry in the nation. The Pakistan 2009 Strategic Review has paid dividends despite political instability in the country. Partnership with World Link has increased funding significantly in the region. The SU Team in the Region faces the New Year with renewed hope and commitment.

SU Fellowship Group

The SU Bangladesh Board ceased to function in the latter part of 2010. A new Fellowship Group consisting of leaders from many Christian organisations was formed in August 2010. Much enthusiasm and a strategic plan for future SU ministry is developing in the Fellowship Group in Dhaka.

SU Team Impacts Villages

Pullangkullam is a remote rural village in South India where three enthusiastic young volunteer teachers bring SU ministry to around 150 children, aged from 5 to 20. The children wrap 'beedis' (cigars) during the day and gather to study in the evening. The village is predominantly Hindu, but the parents are beginning to be interested in what's happening with their children. The SU Team is now gathering the parents in a bid to revive the whole village community.
